MINUTES

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE EAST SEVIER COUNTY UTILITY DISTRICT

Thursday, October 11, 2018

The Board of Commissioners of the East Sevier County Utility District met at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, October 11, 2018, in the Office of The East Sevier County Utility District, 1529 Alpine Drive, Sevierville, TN 37876. Commissioners present were Roy Ivey, President; Barbara Darby, Secretary/Treasurer; and Janice Brooks—Headrick.

President Roy Ivey called the meeting to order at 5:32 p.m. for any old or new business.

A motion to approve the minutes of the September 13, 2018, meeting was made by Barbara Darby; Janice Brooks-Headrick seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the Accounts Payable listing in total as submitted was made by Janice; Barbara seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Reports

James Ford, Local Manager went over District financials with the Commissioners. Barbara made a motion to approve the treasury report; Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

James submitted his report concerning District financials. We install three new pump kits, which means more revenue for the District. We installed a new line to the drip field at Sherwood Forest. Well C area was flushed twice.

A new checking account was opened for the WWTP project fund. In September a confined space training session was conducted to help safeguard our employees from hazardous environments.

Persons to be Heard

Barbara Jones of 1512 Alpine Drive brought in the elements from her hot water tank, which is about 15 months old. The elements were severely corroded. They also had to replace two thermostats. The hot water tank cost \$1,000 new, and they have spent \$300 in replacement parts. She said that since they moved into the house in January of 2017, they have had to keep bottled water in stock. This is an added expense that they should not have.

Tony Lehmann of 1556 Black Oak Drive commented about what a good job Alliance is doing with keeping up with leak repairs. He is doing improvements on his property and asked what he could do as the homeowner. James said he could install a new valve at the end of his street. James will work with him to find the line.

Brett Nichols of 1264 Low Sunset is thinking about putting a new addition on his house and asked if it is possible for him to tap into our sewer. We are going to research it and let him know at the next meeting.

Roy is working at Steve Bradley's house at 1121 Hollyberry Court and said that his sewer must be hooked up by next month.

Old Business

There was no old business to discuss.

New Business

The Well C improvements are out for bid. The bid opening will be October 23. We are hoping to break ground for the new wastewater plant by Spring 2019.

Janice motioned to approve Draws 1 and 2 for the USDA RD Wastewater Project. Barbara seconded the motion. Motion carried. Roy had signed Draw 1 Interim Certificate at September's Board meeting without an approval being made by the Board. This meeting, Roy signed the Interim Certificate for Draw 2. Funds for Draw 1 have already been deposited to the Wastewater Fund account. We will pay the attorney when Draw 2 moneys are available.

Tony Sneed brought up the topic of purchasing vehicles. He suggested we purchase one per year for rotation purposes and to prevent overspending. He suggested we purchase only one truck and one ATV this year. The vehicles do not have to be new; used with under 20,000 miles would suffice. Any vehicle with more that 150,000 miles on it will probably cost more in repairs than it would to replace it. We should begin by replacing the least reliable vehicle first.

FOR VALUE RECEIVED, East Sevier County Utility District of Sevier County, Tennessee hereby acknowledges itself to owe and for value received hereby promises to pay to the registered owner hereof the sum of \$__1,650___\ on or before **November 14, 2020**, together with interest at the rate of **2.875%** per annum until paid, such interest being payable at maturity. Both principal hereof and interest hereon are payable in lawful money of the United States of America by electronic fund transfer or by check or draft mailed to the registered owner at the address shown on the registration book. Upon final payment, this certificate shall be submitted to the Registrar for cancellation.

This certificate, together with such notes as may be issued, is one of a series in an authorized aggregate principal amount of up to \$266,000, issued by the District, for the purpose of providing funds to finance water and sewer system improvements and extensions, pending the issuance of Water and Sewer Revenue Bond (the "Bond") authorized by resolution of the Board of Commissioners of the District on September 12, 2017 which the United States of America has agreed to purchase.

This certificate is transferable by the registered holder hereof, or by its attorney duly authorized in writing, on the registration books of the District, at the office of the Secretary of the District, as Registrar, and the notation of such transfer and registration by the Registrar on the registration books. All assignees shall take this certificate subject to such condition. The District may treat the registered owner as the absolute owner hereof for all purposes, and shall not be affected by any notice to the contrary whether or not any payments due on this certificate shall be overdue.

It is hereby certified and recited that all acts, conditions and things required by the constitution and by the laws of the State of Tennessee to exist, or to be done precedent to and in the issuance of this obligation, do exist, and have been properly done, happened, and been performed in regular and due form and time as required by law; and that provision has been made to pay the principal and interest thereon as same falls due.

This certificate and the income therefrom are exempt from all present state, county and municipal taxes in Tennessee except (a) Tennessee excise taxes on interest on the Certificate during the period the Certificate is held or beneficially owned by any organization or entity, other than a general partnership or sole proprietorship, doing business in the State of Tennessee, and (b) Tennessee franchise taxes by reason of the inclusion of the book value of the Certificate in the Tennessee franchise tax base of any organization or entity, other than a general partnership or sole proprietorship, doing business in the State of Tennessee.

This certificate is subject to prepayment prior to maturity at the option of the District, in whole or in part, at any time at the principal amount thereof and accrued interest to the date of prepayment.

This certificate is a special obligation of the District, payable from the proceeds of the above-described bond and from the net revenues of the water and sewer system of the District.
