MINUTES

BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE EAST SEVIER COUNTY UTILITY DISTRICT

Thursday, December 19, 2019

The Board of Commissioners of the East Sevier County Utility District met at 5:30 p.m. on Thursday, December 19, 2019, in the Office of the East Sevier County Utility District, 1529 Alpine Drive, Sevierville, TN 37876. Commissioners present were Roy Ivey, President; Barbara Darby, Secretary/Treasurer; and Janice Brooks—Headrick.

President Roy Ivey called the meeting to order at 5:33 p.m. for any old or new business.

A motion to approve the minutes of the November 14, 2019, meeting was made by Barbara; Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A motion to approve the Accounts Payable listing in total as submitted was made by Barbara; Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Reports

James Ford, Local Manager, asked the Commissioners if they had any questions about the financials. None of them had questions. Barbara motioned to approve the financial report as presented, Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

James then discussed operations. The staff did a good job supplying water to the fire department when a house on K O Way caught fire. Unfortunately, it was a total loss to the owner. Afterward, the fire chief, Pete Kleinman, called to say thank you to the staff for their help.

This past month on the Mountain, filters were changed at Well A/B, and the entire Mountain was flushed. Offsite, two pump kits we installed at Sherwood Forest. A repair was made at Douglas Lake backflow prevention assembly, and we replaced a pump at the Bear Creek Crossing WWTP.

During the month our staff correctly troubleshooted a septic tank situation and made necessary corrections. The customer extended his gratitude, saying that his home was going to be full for Thanksgiving weekend. We are still awaiting a response from TDEC regarding the proposed WWTP.

Our November safety meeting covered chlorine safety. Because of our improvement projects, only three customers were without water during a main break repair on Black Oak Drive. Before the improvement, dozens of customers would have been affected.

We repaired a few water and sewer leaks last month. James announced that he got his Collection II license so we are good on licensing.

Persons to be Heard

Lisa Hawthorne spoke on behalf of her parents, Walter and Mary Tasker of 1523 Lin Creek Road, concerning their rental property at 1530 Lin Creek Road. She stated she had stopped paying the bill at 1530 because the dwelling has not been used for some time because it is uninhabitable. She said she didn't think it fair that her parents had to pay a water bill for a property that couldn't be used. She said the water meter was stolen a while back and the utility pole had been damaged, which took out the electric going to the trailer.

The Board said that they would need to consult the Rules and Regulations to see what the policy was for that situation. James said he would look and let Lisa know.

James said that the audit was going well. A draft of the audit results was included in the Board packet. James pointed out that page 28 showed that the District did not have an accurate representation of total water usage for the fiscal year because two of our largest users were being billed a flat rate. Since the State requires this information, the number gallons had to be estimated.

Meters have since been installed at all locations that formerly had none. The current fiscal year is the first for having accurate water usage to report. The Commissioners agreed to approve the audit draft. Barbara motioned to continue with the audit draft; Janice seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Darrell Baker had attained bids for a landscaping project at Bear Creek Crossing to restore some of the property to its former condition after we had made some repairs. The lowest bid was for \$4,000 made by Wells Landscaping. Janice motioned to accept the bid of \$4,000 for the landscaping project; Barbara seconded the motion. Motion carried. James reminded the Commissioners of the Christmas party hosted by Alliance which will take place tomorrow night at Calhoun's restaurant in Gatlinburg.

The next regular meeting will be held on Thursday, January 09, 2019, at 5:30 p.m.

December 2019

Administrative

A description of our new payment service has been mailed out to our customers. Many customers have asked for more modern payment options and ESCUD has delivered.

Management remains in communication with TDEC and USDA regarding the wastewater improvement project.

Treatment

Treatment at the wells is monitored daily. Water treatment has improved since the installation of the filters at well C.

Treatment at the wastewater plant is effective. All monthly parameters were within permit limits.

Collection/Distribution

Installed two pump kits at Smoky Mountain Ridge

Repaired heater at Well C treatment building

Preventative jetting was performed on low lying area around the sewer plant

Annual backflow inspections are complete

Cleared sewer blockage at the English Mountain Condos

Purchased a new set of tires for the ESCUD Ranger

Customer Service

Customer on K.O. Way thanked staff for a quick response and repair of a leak situation during the holiday season.

Regulatory

Monthly Water and Wastewater reports were successfully submitted to the Tennessee Department of Environment and Conservation.

Training

Staff members were trained by Aqua Clear personnel on how to service flow meters at well sites. This knowledge will help staff troubleshoot difficult situations more quickly.

Concerns for the Month

Although the holiday season has winded down, winter driving safety continues to be a priority for the ESCUD staff.

Positives for the Month

For the second month in a row, an appropriately placed valve from the improvement project has helped keep a large number of customers in service while a water leak was being repaired.

Leak Repairs

Sewer leaks were addressed at Sherwood Forest and Lashbrooke Estates.
